Mini 4-H Horse and Pony

Mini 4-H Horse and Pony Mini 4-Hers Must be enrolled in mini to show at the county fair. They must show an animal that is already at the fairgrounds—no bringing your own animal. A family member 18 or older must be the handler for the horse. You must still complete the poster project and turn in at mini judging on July 11 to show a horse. There is a waiver/form that must be turned in with the poster in order to show. See the extension office with questions.

Vaccination Reports

Must COMPLETE, including proof of purchase or vet signature, and carry to ALL 4-H events. MUST be on file with leaders before the horse gets off trailer at first clinic, show, and/or fair, whichever comes first. ****Must be a copy of Purdue form--NOT just a receipt from vet.

RULES REVIEW

- 19. A member may show only one animal in any one class. During the county fair show, a member may have another Johnson County 4-H member show a 2nd project animal in the owner's name, in a halter class. Each animal may be shown only once in a class.
- 20. 4-H members must show their own animals (except when Rule #4 or 5 applies). In case of sickness of or an injury to a 4-H member prior to the fair show, the owner or lessee may have the animal shown in the appropriate halter class by another Johnson County 4-H member with the approval of the 4-H Horse & Pony Committee (No Showmanship or Performance Classes). (Except when Horse & Pony Rule #15 and General Rule #5 applies.)
- 21. This is a 4-H member project and preparation should be done throughout the 4-H year. Parents, Trainers, Coaches, Helpers, etc. should avoid coaching from outside the ring during 4-H shows and activities.
